## 2019-2021 Program

### Introduction

Hosted at Peninsula Bible Church, the new Disciple Foundry is a re-framing of the former Intern Program that has been active at PBC since the 1970s. We seek to establish a new set of leaders who will take on that challenge of transforming the bay for Christ. Leaning on the long, deep history of the original PBC Intern program, the Foundry hopes to expand to reach outside PBC as well as to use the resources available today at PBC to bring a new training program for Christians.

## Program Details

Two courses are offered each quarter, five weeks each. Classes are given twice each week, on Tuesday evenings and repeated on Wednesday mornings. Students can attend either class, to allow flexibility for individual schedules. In addition, each class will be recorded and the audio made available to students who miss both in-class offerings. We may offer electives during the 2-year period, given on Sunday mornings; these may count toward the program's completion.

To obtain the two-year program certification the following requirements must be met

- A total of 12 courses must be taken - some electives may be offered over a series of Sunday mornings and can be counted toward this total.
- For each course, only 1 class may be missed and the audio recording must be used to make up the content. All homework must be done, even on missed classes.
- Students will be mentored individually and must meet with their mentors at least once each quarter of the program.

- Each course is offered pass/fail – missed classes, missed homework and lack of make-up of classes or assignments may cause a student to fail a course. Courses may be repeated until completion of certificate.

Although a two year program, students may enter in any Fall Quarter.

Courses may be audited in any quarter by anyone. If auditing, no homework will be required, although for maximum benefit students are encouraged to do the homework assignments. Audited courses will not be counted toward certification.

## Pre-Reading

Pre-reading assignments for the summer prior to the start of the program are geared toward the needs of the individual student. Choose the one that suits your needs best.

### 1. For beginners who do not know **Bible Study Methods**

Read Living by the Book, by Hendricks (392 pages)

### 2. For people who already **know Bible Study Methods** and are **ready for a bigger picture** of the biblical narrative

Read How to Read the Bible Like a Seminary Professor, by Mark Yarbrough (346 pages)

Read The Drama of Scripture, by Bartholomew and Goheen (252 pages)

Read God's Big Picture, by Vaughan (160 pages)

### 3. For more **graduate level** pre-Study on hermeneutics

Read Exegetical Fallacies, by Carson (148 pages)

Read Invitation to Biblical Interpretation, by Kostenberger and Patterson (891 pages)

Read Hermeneutical Spiral, by Osbourne (624 pages)

### 4. General Understanding of **Classical Seminary Training**

Read The Portable Seminary: A Master's Level Overview in One Volume, by Horton (752 pages)

## **Bible Study Class**

A five-week Bible Study Class is offered Fall 2019 (dates TBD) during the 1st service in the Fellowship Hall. For those students without a strong comfort level in exegeting passages of the Bible, this course is highly recommended. The program will be co-taught Jeff Louie and Rolana Smith.

### **Bible Study Class Content**

- Observation + Role of Prepositions
- Word and concordance usage + Semantic range and technical terms
- Genre + Metaphors and Poetry
- Immediate Context + Book Context
- Historical Context + Canonical Context

At the end of the Bible Study class, students will

- Know how to use a concordance
- Be able to describe a book's themes
- Understand the roles of grammar, context, genre, and semantics

## **Mentorship**

Students will be mentored individually and must meet with their mentors at least once each quarter of the program. Once selected for the program, a mentor from PBC will be assigned.
